VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

DUTIES:

The Water Resources Director administers water rights and ensures compliance with water code, permits, determinations, orders, regulations, plans, policies and guidelines. Inspects methods of diversion, withdrawal and other activities affecting reservation water quality and quantity. Installs measuring devices for the purpose of enforcing and administering the water code and monitors water use, water quality and diversions. Confers with farmers, officials of irrigation districts, representatives of federal, state and local governments on matters such as water delivery schedules, construction problems and diversion of water. Initiates by citation and other means, enforcement proceedings pursuant to adopted codes.

The Water Resources Director hires, supervises and terminates office and technical staff in accordance with tribal procedures for joint programs. Develops office budgets, policies and procedures. Conducts public educational programs regarding reservation water rights administration, irrigation management, water quality, environmental issues and water conservation. Develops the internal tribal technical and managerial capabilities to promote the direct involvement of tribal staff in the development and construction of water resources supply, distribution and management facilities and devices.

The Water Resources Director provides professional advice and advises CRIT on all water resource related development planning issues and provides suggestions, recommendations for water quality management. Recommends land areas and waters as suitable for dedication to beneficial uses. Recommends designation of surface and ground

water regions as “critical management areas” and proposes specialized provisions for management within such regions.

The Water Resources Director researches and determines water supply and quality characteristics and development possibilities. Collects, maintains and analyzes information regarding reservation and basin-wide water resources and quality. Organizes and develops a computerized database of reservation water resource information. Develops data regarding the overall carrying capacity of the reservation’s water system. Determines the extent of potential effects on existing water users from proposed uses of reservation water. Identifies new or analyzes existing uses and means of developing, managing, conserving and otherwise protecting tribal water resources. Identifies promising research areas regarding tribal water resources and solicits research proposals by government, university or private sources. Conducts hydrologic investigations to determine water needs.

REQUIREMENTS:

Master’s Degree in Civil or Agricultural Engineering, or Geophysics specialized in Hydrology, or related degree. Requires four years experience in water resource administration, management or development. Must be computer literate and have excellent communication skills. Valid Driver’s License is required.
