## **Second Positive Case of Coronavirus for the Colorado River Indian Tribes**

The Colorado River Indian Tribes has been notified of the second positive resulting from an individual who was tested in another county. The individual is a resident of the Colorado River Indian Reservation. The individual is not currently hospitalized and is recovering at home.

The individual was present at Irataba Hall during the employee testing for COVID-19 on May 6th. Irataba Hall and affected offices will be professionally cleaned and sanitized. We are strongly urging all individuals to limit contact outside your immediate household as much as possible and to wear a face mask when you must be outside of your home.

The Department of Health and Social Services will work in conjunction with Parker Indian Health Center and La Paz Health Department to identify and notify any contacts the individual may have had recently. If you have any symptoms such as fever, shortness of breath, cough, sore throat, headache, myalgias (body aches), chills, repeating shaking with chills, and new loss of taste or smell please contact the Parker Indian Health Center or your primary physician.

All residents are reminded to follow the Stay at Home Order, Resolution No. 54-20. Everyone needs to stay home except for essential tasks and limit contact with anyone who is not a member of your immediate household. The best ways to protect yourself are to take certain precautions including:

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water is unavailable, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Wear a face mask when you must leave your home to conduct essential tasks.

Avoid close contact with anyone outside of your immediate household.

Stay home when you are sick.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

Cover your cough or sneezes with a tissue and immediately discard the tissue in the trash.
