About CDO

Our mission is to serve eligible CRIT Tribal Members and provide them the opportunity to achieve their educational goals.

General Eligibility

- Enrolled member of the Colorado River Indian Tribes
- High School graduate with 2.25 cumulative grade point average (GPA) or GED graduate with a 45% composite score
- Former/Continuing Undergraduate students are required to meet a cumulative 2.50 GPA from last institution attended
- Graduate students are required to have earned a Bachelor's degree and required to meet a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher
- Be accepted, admitted, and enrolled at an accredited college/university or accredited vocational training facility
- Apply for all available funding sources (Pell Grant, SSIG, etc.)
- Be pursuing a degree, certificate, or diploma

Main Services

Adult Vocational Training

The Adult Vocational Training (AVT) Program is designed for students pursuing a Certificate, Diploma, or an Associate of Applied Science or degree program.

Qualified candidate shall attend a trade school or community college that offers a certificate or degree program.

Higher Education

The Higher Education (HE) Program is designed for students pursuing on Associates of Arts/Sciences, Bachelor, Master, and/or Doctorate degrees.

Qualified candidates shall attend an accredited community college or university.

Certificate Enhancement Program Services

The Enhancement Services Program is designed for Tribal Member students. Who are enrolled in a certificate program to enhance their career or refresher course.

Youth Services

The Youth Services Program is designed for Tribal Member students under 21 years of age to help with *academic endeavors* such as camps, conferences, exchange programs, boarding school allowances/graduation expenses. Applications are accepted year-round as funding is available.

Boarding School Assistance

Providing assistance to students showing academic achievement or academic excellence while attending boarding school.

Other Programs & Incentives

Direct Employment (Job Enhancement) Program:

Funding for training that enhances your current job;

Relocation expenses available to newly hired Tribal Members moving out of the area or returning to the area – *supporting documents required, submissions are accepted year-round as funding is available.*

Application Assistance – FASFA, College/Trade School, Collegiate Housing, Boarding School, etc.

Graduation Incentive – *must be enrolled in CDO's HE Program or AVT Program.*

Dean's List Incentive – *must be enrolled in CDO's HE Program and based on 3.5 or higher GPA.*

Computer Purchase Program – *must be enrolled in CDO's HE Program and in the second year of tribal funding in good academic standing.*

Perfect Attendance Incentive – *Must be enrolled in CDO's AVT Program.*

Funding for entrance exams (SAT, ACT, etc.)
