General Provisions:

Camping Fee: \$15.00 per day, per family

Family constitutes a man and wife and their unmarried children under the age of 18.

Friends or relatives (not immediate family) camping together in one vehicle, tent or RV, one (1) permit is required for up to three (3) individuals, the fourth person is required to have a second permit.

Recreation permits are nonrefundable and nontransferable.

Rules and Regulations

1. It is illegal to use or be present in any portion of a campsite area under the control of the department for use fee has been established, without paying such fee.
2. No person shall molest, hunt, disturb, injure, trap, take, net, poison, harm or kill any kind of animal or fish or so attempt in a campsite area, except that fish may be taken other than commercial purposes in accordance with the Tribal fishing laws and regulation, provided however, that no person shall use or discharge a spear or bow and arrow in the campsite area.
3. It is illegal to willfully or negligently pick, dig up, cut, mutilate, destroy, injure, disturb, move, molest, burn or carry away any tree or plant or portion thereof.
4. It is illegal to destroy, mutilate or remove earth, sand, gravel, minerals, rocks, paleontological feature or features of caves.
5. It is illegal to remove, injure, disfigure, deface or destroy any object of archeological or historical interest or value.
6. It is illegal to leave, deposit, drop or scatter bottles, broken glass ashes, waste paper, cans or other litter in a campsite area except in a receptacle designed for that purpose and no person shall import any litter or import or deposit any litter into or in any campsite area from other places.

Rules and Regulation Continued

7. It is illegal to light, build, use or maintain a fire within a campsite area. Portable camp stoves may be used in campsite areas approved by the Department.

8. It is illegal to possess or discharge across, in or into any portion of any campsite area any weapon, firearm, bow and arrow, trap, net or device capable of injuring or killing any person or animal, or capturing any animal, or damaging any public or private property. **All FIREARMS MUST BE UNLOADED AND STORED IN A MANNER THAT WILL PREVENT THEIR READY USE.**

9. It is illegal to possess, discharge, set off or cause to be discharged, in or into any portion of a campsite area any firecrackers, torpedoes, rockets, fireworks, explosives or substances harmful to the life of any persons.

10. To ensure peace and adequate rest for visitors, no person shall so conduct himself or herself that he or she disturbs other in sleeping quarters or in campgrounds between the hours of 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM daily.

11. It is illegal to deposit waste, water, sewage or effluent from sinks, portable toilets or other plumbing fixtures directly upon or into the surface of the ground or water.

12. It is illegal to camp in any area other than a designated campsite. Camping is defined as erecting a tent or shelter or arranged bedding or both for purposes or in such a way as will permit, remaining overnight.

13. Fees for the use of camping facilities are due and payable daily. The fee covers use of camping facilities until the vacating time of 2:00 PM of the following day.

14. **It is illegal to occupy any campsite for more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.**

15. It is illegal for any person to be present or remain in any campsite area between the hours of 10:00 PM and 6 AM except as the lawfully registered occupant of campsites are available.

In addition to other penalties by law, violation of any law or regulation shall subject the violator to ejection from the campsite area in which the violation occurs or from the reservation if warranted.

Refusal or failure to exhibit a license or permit on demand of any Game Warden or Law Enforcement Officer or other representative of the Colorado River Indian Tribes is unlawful.

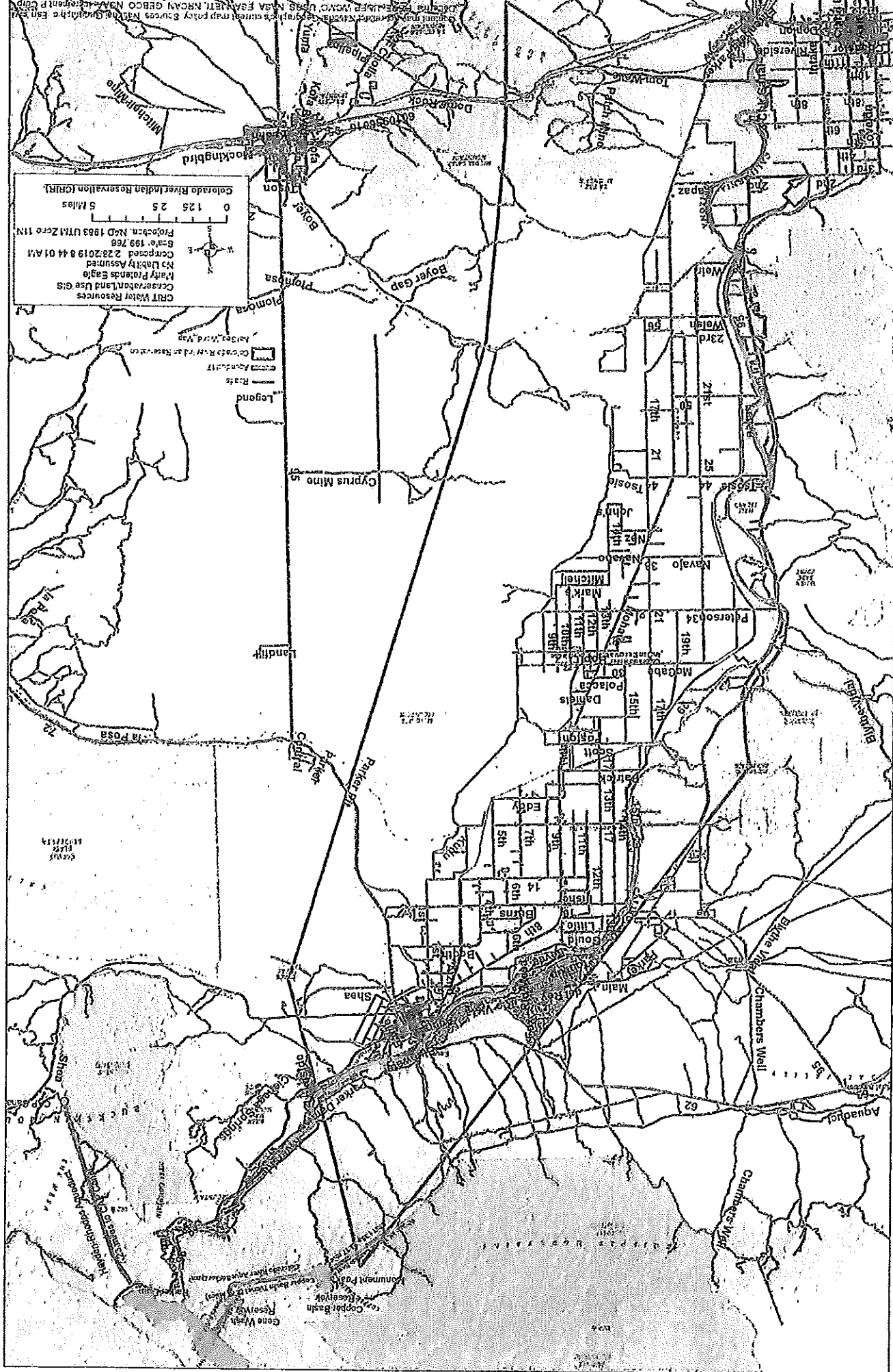
